May 13 - Friday

Meteor Crater & Winslow's Standin on the Corner Park

Walk the rim of the world's best preserved meteor impact crater with a guide to relate the history and mysteries. Watch the movie – "IMPACT, Mystery of Meteor Crater" to experience the power of this event and then explore the museum. Enjoy a bag lunch or Subway sandwich in the courtyard. On the way back to Camp Verde we stop at the most famous street corner in America "Standin on the Corner" Park in Winslow. Enjoy the views as we return through the pines of Clint's Well and the drop into the Valley along Rte 260.

May 26 - Thursday

Sharlot Hall Museum & Downtown Prescott

Walk the grounds filled with buildings and artifacts from Arizona Territorial history and early Statehood. Tour the first Governor's Mansion as well as a Victorian era house, early settler cabins, wagons and Sharlot Hall's 1927 Durant Star Touring car. Stroll up to Downtown Prescott just two blocks away for dining and shopping options.

June 9 - Thursday

Phippen Museum & Downtown Prescott

Founded to showcase the work of George Phippen, local artist, founding member and first President of the Cowboy Artists of America. Enjoy art by noted western painters and sculptors & see western heritage artifacts and memorabilia. After visiting the museum we travel to downtown Prescott to choose from the many restaurants, shops and galleries around Courthouse Square.

June 23 - Thursday

Museum of Northern Arizona & Downtown Flagstaff

Explore this world class museum dedicated to the geography, geology and culture of the Colorado Plateau. Displays of prehistoric and historic Native American artifacts and more modern works of fine art and jewelry of the Plateau's Native American inhabitants. Learn about the physical world that helped to create the varied cultures of this area. Then travel to Downtown Flagstaff for your choice of lunch destinations and a chance to explore what Flagstaff has to offer.

July 14 - Thursday

Lowell Observatory & Downtown Flagstaff

Explore this historic and still active astronomical observatory atop Mars Hill. Experience a guided tour of the history of astronomy leading to the discovery of Pluto and beyond. Stroll the grounds and visit the exhibit hall for a display on the Hubbell Space Telescope.

July 28 - Thursday

Riordan Mansion & Pioneer Museum

This 1904 duplex home was built for two lumber baron brothers who married two sisters and helped make Flagstaff the community it is today. Enjoy a guided tour of this well preserved master piece for a glimpse back into another time. After a stop for a variety of fast food options or your own bag lunch we continue our history of Flagstaff with a visit to the Pioneer Museum. Housed in the 1908, Coconino County Hospital for the Indigent this collection of artifacts and displays gives another glimpse into early Flagstaff life.
