## CSP STRATEGIC PLANNING MEETING HELD

On Friday, January 28, 2010, the Town Council, Planning Commission, Scoping Team, General Plan Update Team, the Town Manager and Department Heads met in an all-day strategic planning session to explore possible future directions for the Clarkdale Sustainability Park. Following an introduction by Mayor Doug von Gausig and an overview of the recent evolution of the project by Town Manager Gayle Mabery, four separate teams worked on defining what a sustainable community entails for Clarkdale to further the understanding of the CSP's Vision:

### To be an evolutionary solution for a sustainable community.

Following reports from each group back to the whole, the teams considered success factors looking forward 2 and 20 years which were then prioritized and shared.

From all this work, the ideas are being compiled and will be released to the list serve for those interested in following project progress. A work plan is also forthcoming which will be presented for public input and modification with the final product ultimately coming before the Town Council for review and approval. ## LOWER TOWN WATER LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Three of the four phases of the Lower Town Water Line Replacement Project are complete as of this writing. The Town received a "Certificate to Operate" for Phase 1 on January 12, 2011. Phase 1 includes the commercial area at Third North Street, as well as residential areas on Third North Street from Fourth Street to Broadway. The Town is happy to announce that we connected our first resident to the new system on Friday, January 21, and we will continue to connect additional residents during the next two months.

Phases 2 and 3 include a majority of the alleys from Third North Street to Main Street, between Broadway and Fourth Street. For Phase 2 and part of Phase 3, testing results and "as-builts" have been submitted to the Town Engineer who, after a review, will submit these to the County. The County will then review and approve the construction and issue a "Certificate to Operate" for these phases.

The final phase (Phase 4) includes Main Street from Rincon Drive to Fourth Street and the alley south of Main between Fourth Street and Broadway. This phase will begin Tuesday, February 1; we expect completion within two weeks.

The Town once again would like to thank the citizens for their patience and cooperation during this construction process. The contractor has been very cooperative in ensuring that there is minimal impact on our residents' lives.
